Before You Register

Although there are no formal pre-requisites for these challenging courses, good standing in a human biology course at the senior secondary or introductory university level is highly recommended.

For SCS 2472 Biochemistry with a Medical Perspective, a first-year university introductory chemistry course is also recommended.

Before registering, students planning to use this course for admission to any academic program are strongly advised to obtain written confirmation from the institution to which they are applying whether this course meets the prerequisites of their intended degree program.

What Does My Computer Need In Order To Use Quercus?

High-Speed Internet Connection: You need access to a reliable high-speed internet connection on your own computer or a public computer. Minimum speed: 512 Kb / sec. You can verify your internet speed free at www.speedtest.net.)

When Will I Receive Information About Accessing My Course?

Approximately three calendar days prior to the start date, information about accessing your online course will be sent to the email account that you used to register with the School of Continuing Studies. If you are a late registrant, access information will take two business days to generate. If you have not received your course access information within the timeframes mentioned above, please contact the School of Continuing Studies by phone 416.978.2440.

What If My Course Is Not Listed When I Log In To Quercus?

A. You may be logged in using credentials (UTORid and password) that were sent to you in previous semesters. Please make sure you are signing in using the credentials that are sent to you from learn@utoronto.ca for your current course. If you do not have that information, please contact the School of Continuing Studies at learn@utoronto.ca or by phone at 416.978.2400.

B. Your instructor may have decided to make the course unavailable until the official start date of the course. Please wait until the start date of your course to see your course listed in the Quercus. If you do not see it by then, please contact the School of Continuing Studies at <u>learn@utoronto.ca</u> or by phone at 416.978.2400.

Am I Entitled To Access The University's Wireless (Wifi) Network On The Campus?

Yes, when you are on any of the U of T campuses, you can connect to the "UofT" network. You will be asked to enter your username and password. These are your UTORid and the password associated with it.

Examinations and Final Grades

How And Where Do I Write Exams?

Final examinations, where applicable, are conducted at locally situated, proctored exam centres. Exams can be taken almost anywhere in the world. See the Exam Application form posted within your course on Quercus for more information. The Exam Application Form can also be found here: <u>https://learn.utoronto.ca/help/forms-and-applications/medical-online-exam-application</u>.

Examinations are held in the morning and the afternoon. If you are taking two courses, your exams will be staggered, one after the other. If you are taking more than two, contact the School to make special arrangements. There is a supplementary charge of Cdn \$125 for students outside Canada and the U.S.

How Do I Register To Write My Exam?

Complete the online examination form posted in Quercus, and submit it by the deadline stated on the form. A reminder with information about the exam location will be sent to you two weeks prior to the exam date. Please note: the deadline for applying for an examination is soon after the course starts.

If I Cannot Write The Exam On The Scheduled Date, What Are My Options?

If you are unable to write a scheduled exam for a serious reason, you may apply to write an alternate exam in the next scheduled exam period. The fee for this service is Cdn \$150 and the application form is found here: https://learn.utoronto.ca/how-to-register/forms-applications Please note that if you fail a final exam, you are not eligible to write an alternate. You will have to take the course again and complete all materials from the beginning of the course again.

Where Will My Final Grade Be Posted?

You can view your final course grade by logging in to your MyAcess student account on the website of the School of Continuing Studies: <u>https://learn.utoronto.ca/login</u> Your final exam mark and the final course grade will not be posted in Quercus.

When Will My Final Grade Be Posted?

Your final grade is posted in your student account at the School approximately four to six weeks after the exam.

How Can I Receive A Grade Report?

A downloadable "grade report" for the course is posted in your student MyAccess account at the School four to six weeks after the exam. You can log in to your account through the MyAccess login page: https://learn.utoronto.ca/login

If you require an official transcript of your entire academic history at the School, you can apply for one by using the Transcript Application form at the link below: <u>https://learn.utoronto.ca/how-to-register/forms-applications</u>

In the case of SCS 2900 Pharmacology: Principles and Clinical Applications and SCS 2472 Biochemistry with a Medical Perspective, the transcript comes with an official form letter from the Department, describing the course.
